# **Population & Weather**

### **Population**

According to the most recent data by the US Census Bureau in 2020, the average household income in Richmond is about \$76,182 with a median rental cost of \$1,070 per month. The median house value is about \$244,200. The median age of residents is 34 years old.

Richmond has a diverse population. A study by Finder.com ranked Richmond as the most diverse city in the United States in 2021.

### Weather

Experience each season for what it has to offer! In Richmond, the summers are hot and perfect for enjoying the river, beach, or swimming pool. Winters are cold enough to get snow at least once a year to every other year. Autumn is a gorgeous season to experience in Virginia, where the leaves change to vibrant orange, red, and yellow. We enjoy moderate temperatures in the spring.



# **Cost of Living**

### **Groceries**

The average monthly cost of groceries for a single adult is \$279 in the city of Richmond. Families with two adults and two children are estimated to spend an average of \$807 monthly on groceries (Economic Policy Institute, 2022).

### **Utilities**

According to the City of Richmond, the monthly water costs per household are calculated by multiplying the current water rate by Ccfs of water used per month, then adding the base fee for the size of the meter. The following is an example provided by the City of Richmond:

\$2.85 x 4 Ccfs = \$11.40 + \$16.06 (5/8" Meter) = \$30.31

Gas rates in the city of Richmond are determined by gas usage measured in Ccf and are billed monthly. Bills are totaled by a monthly service charge, volume for gas used, and applicable taxes. The following formula is provided by the city of Richmond:

(Current gas distribution charge)  $\times$  (\_\_\_ Ccfs of gas used per month) = \_\_\_ + (Current purchased gas cost charge)  $\times$  (\_\_\_ Ccfs of gas used per month) = \_\_\_+ (monthly service charge) = Total Gas Bill Electricity in the state of Virginia is provided by Dominion Energy.

#### **Health Care**

Health care expenses for a single-person household are averaged monthly at \$416, whereas a household of two adults and two children is averaged monthly at \$1,258 (Economic Policy Institute, 2022). This is calculated assuming families purchase the lowest cost bronze plans on the health insurance exchange.

### Transportation

Greater Richmond Transit Company runs extensively throughout RVA and the surrounding counties. The local bus transit service offers Greyhound buses to New York City, Washington D.C., and Raleigh. Considering automotive costs, a single-person household will spend about \$824 monthly on auto ownership, auto use, and transit use; a household with two adults and two children will spend an average of \$1,174 (Economic Policy Institution, 2022).

### Summary

According to the Economic Policy Institute, the average annual cost of living for a single adult in the Richmond metro area is \$42,929 with an average monthly cost of \$3,577 (2022).

A household with 2 adults and 2 children is estimated to have an average annual cost of \$89,149 and an average monthly cost of \$3,577 (Economic Policy Institute, 2022).




### Median Home Owner Costs With Mortgage

### The Arts

Richmond has one of the largest comprehensive art museums in the United States, The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts. The VMFA opened in 1936 and is a privately endowed educational institution and state agency. The mission and purpose of the institution are to preserve and interpret art, provide encouragement for the study of the arts, and act as a place for thought-provoking exhibitions. There is an opportunity to participate in arts-related audiovisual programs, lectures and conferences, and workshops by visual artists. There are even social events to attend, such as wine happy hours, fitness meet-ups for Yoga or The November Project, and educational classes for all ages.

There is incredibly interesting history to be observed at the VMFA, with collections of art that span more than 6,000 years and over 40,000 permanent items in the collections to explore. Collections include: "Words Matter & Untold History", "American Land, American People", "Alphonse Mucha: Paris 1900", and many more collections from all over the globe. Examine hieroglyphics and ancient mummies from Ancient Egypt right here in your home city.

The VMFA is a wonderful destination to bring guests that are visiting the city. The museum has free admission every day with several guided tours. Walk-in tours are given daily and there are student group visits that are educational and interactive with a focus on the student's curriculum. Visitors have the option to tour with a group of 10-40 adults and have discount offers for special exhibitions. Enjoy an audio tour on-site, online, or on your mobile device.






Richmond is known for its appreciation of the arts. Famous street artists add expression and creativity to buildings through a variety of murals throughout the city. Richmond is a hot spot for art enthusiasts and for those that are artistically curious. There are 70+ galleries to walk through, many of which display work from the incredibly gifted students who attend Virginia Commonwealth University.

The VMFA is one of 31 museums in Richmond. To name a few, The Edgar Allen Poe Museum, American Civil War Museum and the Virginia Holocaust Museum are especially fascinating and worth touring for historical significance. The Science Museum of Virginia hosts activities and shows for each age demographic and scientific interest; explore The Dome and learn about astronomy, discover fascinating chemical reactions, or observe and learn about animals – including prehistoric animals. The Children's Museum of Richmond provides interactive playgrounds that exercise physical and mental stimulation for children. It is their mission to, "inspire growth in all children by engaging families in learning through play."

The Arts District is a physical embodiment of the best elements of Richmond's creativity and culture. Art galleries, social clubs, theaters, and more can be found in the northern portion of downtown Richmond. Acting as a hub for creativity, commercial activity, and economic development, the Arts District is perfect for a day trip filled with activities to do. Browse various galleries in between shopping at boutiques, such as Verdalina or Jolene on W Broad St before you grab a happy hour drink at Bar Solita. The Arts District is bordered between N. Belvidere on the west, W. Marshall Street to the north, roughly N. 3rd Street to the east, and E. Grace Street to the south.





# **Nature, Parks & Recreation**

The city of Richmond Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities is home to more than 170 parks. This includes a variety of public parks, open spaces, athletic fields, dog parks, playgrounds, and tot lots.

A popular destination is Belle Isle, a preserved park island downtown along the James River. Explore the wetlands that offer diverse ecosystems for wildlife. A unique aspect of this park is the smooth, flat rocks that act as natural sunbathing lounging. The Hollywood Rapids are fascinating to observe, but not suitable for swimming.



### **Sports**

The Richmond Flying Squirrels are the minor league baseball team of the city. They are part of the Eastern League and are the Double-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants major league club. This year, the Flying Squirrels have made it to the Minor League Baseball Eastern League Playoffs - the first time in eight years! Catch the Richmond Flying Squirrels at The Diamond. Tickets start at \$10, but season membership holders receive discounts and perks.

Richmond Kickers is an American professional soccer club. The Kickers compete as a member of USL League One. The club was established in 1993. The Kickers play their home league matches at City Stadium the club's primary home since 1995.

Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) has various sports teams to support, both men's and women's sports. As division 1 basketball teams of the NCAA, the games are sure to bring excitement to the stands!

The Richmond Spiders are the University of Richmond's division 1 basketball team in the NCAA. The Head Coach of the Richmond Spiders, Chris Mooney, is notably successful with his coaching strategies and efforts. This has earned him the title of the most successful coach in Richmond History.





### **Education**

If you have a family household, Richmond and Chesterfield County have various private and public schools to choose from. If your home is zoned for the city of Richmond, both Open High School and Richmond Community High School are public schools that have notable scores for college readiness, test scores, and equity scores far above the state average.

Public elementary schools such as Short Pump Elementary and Tuckahoe Elementary are proud to report that their students show more academic progress from one grade to the next. Chesterfield County School District made it to the list of "Best School Districts of Virginia," and "Best School Districts for Athletes in Virginia." Check out our neighborhood guides for more details on which public schools you may be zoned for.

Richmond has 56 private schools with the average tuition cost being lower than the state of Virginia's private school average tuition cost. Over half of these private schools are religiously affiliated, such as Buford Road Christian Academy (Baptist), and some are designated for special education, such as The New Community School. There are all-girls and all-boys academies as well as combined education.







No matter what you are seeking in a private school, Richmond has a school fit for your child's needs. The Steward School, a co-ed private school in Richmond, has a college preparatory curriculum, small classes, individual attention, extracurriculars, inschool tutoring and after-school programs. The mission of The Steward School is to prepare your child for their future and to develop their students to succeed in our rapidly changing world.

Maggie L. Walker Governor's School for Government and International Studies (ML-WGS) is an excellent public school in the Richmond metro area. According to a statement published by the school, the curriculum focuses on a "comprehensive college preparatory program emphasizing government, international studies, science, mathematics, languages, and fine arts" (2019). The school was ranked #8 in Best Public High Schools by Niche in 2019.

Richmond is also home to higher education, such as Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond University, and Virginia Union University.

### **Travel**

Richmond International Airport (RIC) is just 15 minutes from the city and is known as the gateway to Virginia's Capital Region. It plays a pivotal role in economic development and supports world-class business operations.

After a \$300 million renovation, RIC is designed to be as stress-free and convenient for travelers as possible. Entering the parking lot or pick-up is easier than ever, and travelers enjoy a sleek, modern space with additional gates and ticketing counters. The renovation also balanced the professionalism of a large airport with the advantages of a small one.

The eight airlines provided are American Airlines, Breeze Airways, Delta Air Lines, JetBlue Airways, Southwest Airlines, Spirit Airlines, United Airlines, and Allegiant.

To encourage competition, over the past decade there has been a decrease in fare premiums and an increase in quality and frequency of service. This has been favorable to travelers and in return to the economy, injecting millions of dollars into the region.

Amtrak runs to Richmond with three stations for ease of use in the region at Staples Mill, historic Main Street and in the town of Ashland.



### **Healthcare**

According to the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association (VHHA), Virginia ranked in the top 10 nationally for Health Care quality. Michael V. Gentry, Sentara Healthcare Senior Corporate Vice President, Chief Operating Officer, and Chairman of the Board of Directors reflects on this with his statement, "To better serve patients, Virginia hospital leaders have prioritized enhancing health care quality and safety across our individual organizations, and throughout the Commonwealth."


There are 21 hospitals located in or near Richmond. The highest performing hospital is VCU Medical Center, which includes Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU. The hospital was evaluated as high performing for Colon Cancer Surgery, Lung Cancer Surgery, Ovarian Cancer Surgery, and Cardiology & Heart Surgery.

The VHHA's Board of Directors established a vision to make Virginia the healthiest state in the nation. This vision has stretched to each hospital in the region, encouraging constant innovation and providing clinical expertise. Dozens of Virginia hospitals were recognized for exceptional patient safety performance, with nine of them earning the Healthgrades "Outstanding Patient Experience Awards." 21 Virginia hopsitals were recipients of the "Patient Safety Excellence Awards," as of 2017.



# **Our Neighborhoods**

### Downtown



Downtown Richmond is proud to be an active and lively part of the city, consisting of over 300 restaurants, over 150 murals and street art, historic sites and attractions, and the James riverfront access. With recreational parks to dog parks, the outdoor lifestyle thrives even in the most urban parts of the neighborhood. Enjoy a walk or bike ride down the historical riverfront canal, featuring art, restaurants, and centuries of history to observe through medallions, statues, and exhibits. This part of the city calls to people who are adventurous, creative, and curious.

### Scott's Addition

Within walking distance of the neighborhoods in the city, such as Museum District and Monument Avenue, Scott's Addition has the convenience of having all general amenities within 10 minutes of your home. This bustling neighborhood has a reputation for having the best craft beers and breweries, with the Richmond Beer Trail attracting tourists and locals alike to the neighborhood, with 10 breweries located in Scott's Addition alone.



### The Fan

The Fan District is one of the most interesting areas in Richmond because of the unique restaurants and shops. Named after the "fan-like" nature of the streets, it is predominantly a residential area. The Fan is especially curious to admirers of architecture. Wander the streets of The Fan and view the impressive styles from the mid-late 19th century, including Italianate, Queen Anne, Richardsonian, Romanesque, and Colonial Revival





### Churchhill

Also known as St. John's Historic District, Churchhill is the oldest neighborhood in Richmond. It encompasses other neighborhoods in the East End such as Union Hill, Chimborazo, Fairmount, Peter Paul, Woodville and more. Churchhill is known for Chimborazo Park, the location of the largest American Civil War Hospital. It is the site of Virginia's second revolutionary convention, where Patrick Henry gave his "Give me liberty or give me death," speech at St. John's Episcopal Church in the year 1775. Between the history of the neighborhood, there are more must-sees, such as Sub Rosa Bakery, The Hill Café, Proper Pie, and Libby Hill Park.



### Carytown/Museum District

Nestled in the heart of Richmond, Carytown is filled with unique shopping, delicious dining, and various entertainment and events. The neighborhood focuses on small, locally owned businesses. The historic Byrd Theater and unique shopping boutiques are guaranteed to make the visit interesting. The Museum District borders Carytown to the north, where you can find the VMFA and Virginia Museum of History and Culture. Even with all the fun and bustling businesses, you will find single-family homes that line the streets and apartments fit for families and singles.




### Libbie and Grove / Westhampton

In the Near West End, Libbie and Grove offers residential options such as single-family homes, apartments, townhomes, and condos. The neighborhood has a variety of shops, including top-notch restaurants, handmade chocolates and treats, tailors' services, eclectic clothing boutiques, fitness spots, and a local grocery store, Libbie Market. The neighborhood loves to get together for seasonal events, so there is always opportunity to network and meet the community.



# **Henrico County**



Neighborhood construction began in the early 1950s and continues today, with recent redevelopment. This convenient county is just outside the city of Richmond, making it a perfect place for families who desire the perks of the city and the solitude of the suburbs. Residents of Central Henrico have the amenity of being within proximity to popular parks, like Three Lakes Park and Lewis Ginter. The homes in Henrico have a broad range of values, many have lower prices with more than a quarter acre of land, assuring privacy and creating value.

### **Highland Springs**

is a surburban neighborhood located in Henrico, Virginia. Its homes range from medium (3-4 bedrooms) to small (studio-2 bedrooms) in size, and occupants are a mixture of homeowners and renters. Highland Springs' Historic District, located along Nine Mile Road, was first developed in 1890 and once featured an electric trolley line. The neighborhood's convenient location close to Interstate 64 provides easy access into downtown Richmond.



#### Innsbrook

Most residents in Innsbrook are homeowners in the dense suburban area. Innsbrook offers various restaurants to try, coffee shops, and parks to visit with the family. The neighborhood mainly consists of families and young professionals, with highly rated public schools such as Jacob L. Adams Elementary School, Brookland Middle School, and Douglas S. Freeman High School.





### **Short Pump**

Best known for the Short Pump Town Center that offers the most sought-after clothing brands for all ages, this neighborhood and community is filled with options for entertainment and necessities and is family friendly. There are restaurants and bars to try, and it's only about a 15–20-minute drive into the city. The excellent school system includes Short Pump Elementary, Nuckols Farm Elementary, and Deep Run High School.

### Wyndham




### Tuckahoe


### Hampton Park




### Tarrington on the James


### **Timberlake Commons**


### Five Lakes

### Town Center / Ammon


